



Edward C. Slabe

November 5, 1921 - June 21, 2013

Edward C. Slabe age 91, of Maumee, passed away in Ebeid Hospice. A U.S. Army veteran, he was a first lieutenant in the 8th Infantry. He served in Normandy, Northern France, the Rhineland and Central Germany and was instrumental in the liberation of prisoners from a concentration camp.

Ed and his wife Mary were married April 26, 1943. He worked at US Steel, Kaiser Jeep in Toledo and the Carling Brewing Company in Cleveland, Ohio retiring from the Champion Spark Plug Company in 1986 as Director of the Tax Department. He was a history buff and an avid reader who enjoyed spending time with his family.

He was preceded in death by his wife Mary in 1979. Ed is survived by his daughters Cindy (Mike) Hahn and Dori (Gary) Marck; grandchildren Michael (Sheri) Hahn, Rob Hahn, Brian (Lynnette) Hahn, Mary Anne (Nick) Arnold and Joseph (Lizzie) Marck as well as thirteen great-grandchildren.
