



JAMES V. BEARSS

August 14, 1916 - April 2, 2001

Pioneering Horticulturalist

Mr. James V. Bearss, 84 years, passed away peacefully in his South Toledo home Monday morning, April 2, 2001. Jim was born in Toledo August 14, 1916 to Dr. Roy and Myrtle (Blocky) Bearss

Jim was a 1935 graduate of Libbey High School where he was a member of the city championship baseball team, which played in the state tournament. He was also on the track team. He graduated with a B.S. degree in Horticulture from Ohio State University in 1941. He was a WW II Army veteran.

Jim began his Landscape-Nursery business in 1945, operating as Franklin Farm Nursery on the site of the present Franklin Park Mall. The Bearss Landscape Nursery began in 1957 when he moved his business to Dorr Street near Byrne Road. He retired in 1983.

Jim was a co-founder of the former Toledo Landscape Association in 1953 and held memberships in the Ohio State Floriculture/Landscape Association and the Horticulture Alumni Association of Ohio State University.

Surviving are his wife of 60 years, Dorothy (Grossmann) Bearss and children,

William (Kathy) Bearss, Whitehouse, OH, James D. (LaRee) Bearss, Monte Vista, CO and Bonnie (Joe) Coyle, Toledo. His grandchildren are Dr. David Bearss, Rebecca Strader, Dr. Abigail Shoemaker, Zachary, James, Josh, Benjamin Bearss, Jessica Redman, Megan Stamos, Katie Todd and Jeremiah Coyle. The great grandchildren are Lindsey Bearss and Kate Stamos. He is the brother of Mrs. Lois Boswell, Indianapolis, IN. He was preceded in death by his brother, Dick Bearss and sister Dorothy Munger

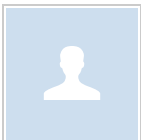

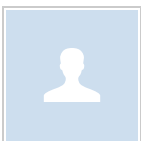
