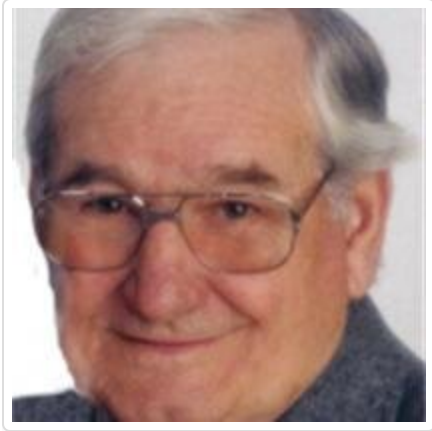




John Armstrong

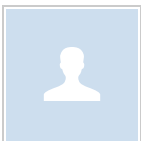
