Michael Bokesch, age 97, passed away peacefully September 6, 2010 in his home.

Michael was born in Romania on June 17, 1913. In his younger years political conditions forced him to serve in the Romanian, Hungarian and German Army. The end of World War II ended his military life. He re-united with his family and they lived in Austria from 1945 until 1956. During this time he worked as a fireman/driver at the local American air base.

In 1956, he and his family immigrated to Toledo, Ohio to find a new homeland and a new beginning. The sponsor for their family was Pastor Roy Hoch of Glenwood Lutheran Church. Michael served Glenwood Lutheran Church as head custodian until he retired in 1979. He was respected by all in the church for his dedication, positive attitude and willingness to serve. He loved gardening, watching football and family get-togethers. Michael Bokesch lived his life with dignity and caring for all those he touched.

He was a wonderful husband to Sophia Bokesch for 62 years until her death in 2000. Surviving are his brother, Johann (Mitzi) Bokesch of Austria and sons: Michael (Laura) Bokesch of Lake Forest, CA and Martin (Karen) Bokesch of Toledo. The grandchildren (Martin and Karen) are Susan (Todd) Moser, Eric (Jennifer) Bokesch, Brian (Sara) Bokesch, and Craig Bokesch. The great-grandchildren are: Brianna Elizabeth Moser, Samuel Martin Bokesch, Audrey Sophia and Ainsley Noel Bokesch.

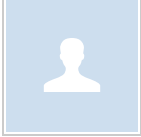
